
The matter having come before the Commission on March 12, 2008; and
the Commission having before it the Stipulation dated March 5, 2008; and respondent
having affirmed that, should the Stipulation be accepted and should he vacate judicial

office for any reason before the Commission renders a determination on the merits pursuant to Article 2-A of the Judiciary Law, the Stipulation, including the annexed Formal Written Complaints, will be made public and respondent will neither seek nor accept judicial office at any time in the future; now, therefore, it is

DETERMINED, on the Commission's own motion, that the Stipulation is accepted and that, pursuant to the terms of the Stipulation: (i) the Decision and Order dated January 29, 2008, granting summary determination is vacated and rendered null and void; (ii) the letter by the Clerk of the Commission dated February 22, 2008, scheduling submissions is declared moot; and (iii) respondent shall be permitted to file Answers to the two pending Formal Written Complaints within 20 days of receipt of this Decision and Order and thereafter the matter may proceed to a hearing before a referee; and it is

SO ORDERED.
