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Jefferson County Village Justice Resigns In Connection With Alleged Financial and Administrative Improprieties

The New York State Commission on Judicial Conduct has completed formal proceedings against Honorable Andrea L. McIntyre, a Justice of the Theresa Village Court, Jefferson County. Pursuant to a stipulation dated July 30, 2010, Judge McIntyre, who resigned from office, agreed not to seek or accept judicial office in the future. On that basis, the proceedings were discontinued and the matter was closed on October 4, 2010.

Under the terms of the stipulation, Judge McIntyre waived the statutory provision of confidentiality applicable to Commission proceedings, to the limited extent that the stipulation would be made public.

The stipulation indicates that the Commission served the judge with a formal written complaint dated May 27, 2010, alleging that she failed to perform numerous administrative and adjudicative responsibilities. The complaint included allegations that the judge failed to deposit approximately \$11,080 in court funds within 72 hours of receipt, failed to sentence 105 defendants who were

convicted of various vehicle and traffic charges, and failed to report 53 “scofflaws” to the Department of Motor Vehicles so that their licenses could be suspended.

Judge McIntyre tendered her resignation from judicial office on July 26, 2010, effective August 11, 2010.

This is the 31st such stipulation in Commission proceedings since the procedure was instituted in 2003.
